Dear Aged Care Resident

I refer you to my letter of 16 December 2021, in which I strongly encouraged you to receive your COVID-19 booster. Your continued protection against COVID-19 remains of paramount importance. Booster doses strengthen your protection from serious illness, hospitalisation or death from COVID-19.

Commonwealth booster clinics have now been delivered across all residential aged care facilities. However, I am concerned that many residents are not yet protected with a COVID-19 booster.

If you have not received your booster dose, please talk to your facility and seek to get a booster as a priority. There are multiple options to get a booster vaccine, including your facility arranging for a general practitioner or pharmacy to visit your facility and provide a booster service. Your facility can also seek an in-reach booster clinic from the Commonwealth government.

You are eligible to receive a booster dose if you received your second dose of a COVID-19 vaccine three or more months prior. If you are yet to complete your primary course of a COVID vaccine, booster clinics can also offer a first or second dose if required, or a third dose for those who are severely immunocompromised.

Commonwealth arranged booster clinics are available for return to residential aged care facilities. Where less than 10 residents require a COVID-19 vaccination, the facility is encouraged to organise for a visiting GP or pharmacist to administer the vaccines. Where this is not possible, a Commonwealth booster clinic will be organised.
