You may choose to pay your accommodation costs by:

You have 28 days from the day you enter care to decide your payment method and during this time (or until you decide on your ongoing payment method) your accommodation costs must be paid by a Daily Accommodation Payment.

Please note: Prices are based on calculations using the current Maximum Permissible Interest Rate (MPIR) and are subject to change with MPIR indexation adjustments. The MPIR will change to 7.65% from 1st January 2026. The combination payment is shown as a 50% RAD, 50% DAP split for example purposes only, the percentage may vary depending on your personal preferences.
